Composer, director and clinician, Ryan Main writes music for choirs and bands at all levels. An award-winning composer, his compositions are performed internationally and frequently featured at national and regional American Choral Directors Association Conferences, festivals, Carnegie Hall, and other distinguished events around the world.

Main was born (1984) in Independence, Missouri. His post-secondary education in music began at the Conservatory of Music and Dance at the University of Missouri–Kansas City (2003-2006). There he received a Bachelor of Music in Music Composition, then pursued graduate studies at the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University from (2006-2009) earning a Masters of Music in music composition and a Masters of Music in music education. His teachers at the Peabody Institute included Kevin Puts and Michael Hersch. He has also studied with composer Chen Yi.

Ryan is a sought-after honor choir director and clinician, and a regular presenter on topics such as leadership strategies, choral classroom engagement, composition processes, and choral literature. He has been a guest on the Choralosophy podcast, the Music (Ed) Matters podcast, the Choir Director Corner podcast, the Choir Ninja podcast, and the Choral Catalogue podcast.

Ryan is passionate about quality music education for all. He founded and serves as artistic director of the Youth Chorus of Kansas City, a non-profit organization serving youth of all socioeconomic and cultural backgrounds throughout the Kansas City metro area. In addition, he remains engaged with aspiring composers, maintaining mentoring relationships with young creators. Ryan is a member of the American Choral Directors Association, the Missouri Choral Directors Association, the National Association for Music Education and the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers. He currently serves on the National Association for Music Education's Council on Music Composition.

Tour Itinerary

DAY 1 - Friday, June 6, 2025 - Travel to New York City

Depart from your destination on a flight or by coach to New York City (flight/coach costs for transfer from your destination to NYC are not included in this proposal but can be priced on request). Arrive in New York City. Meet your tour manager at the hotel and check in. In the late afternoon or early evening you'll have a rehearsal. Dinner is included. Overnight in Manhattan at a 4* mid-town Manhattan Hotel such as Sheraton, Hilton, Marriott or similar.

DAY 2 - Saturday, June 7, 2025 - New York City

A gift card (\$15 per person) is included this morning for breakfast. In the morning or afternoon you'll have a rehearsal at the hotel. Entrance to Top of the Rock is included today (you'll go on foot). Dinner is included this evening as well as a Broadway Show. Overnight in Manhattan at a 4* mid-town Manhattan Hotel such as Sheraton, Hilton, Marriott or similar.

DAY 3 - Sunday, June 8, 2025 - New York City / Carnegie Hall Performance

After breakfast this morning (\$15 gift card per person) you'll have a free morning where your tour manager will be available to walk you around Manhattan and the area. You'll have a substantial late lunch prior to a rehearsal and sound check for this evening's Carnegie Hall performance. Join Ryan Main, the Youth Choir of Kansas City, and other choirs for a performance at Carnegie Hall. A post-concert catered reception is included. Overnight in Manhattan at a 4* mid-town Manhattan Hotel such as Sheraton, Hilton, Marriott or similar.

DAY 4 - Monday, June 9, 2025 - New York City

After breakfast this morning (\$15 gift card per person) you'll visit the 9/11 Memorial and the area around lower Manhattan including Trinity Wall Street church and the Stock Exchange. You'll take the free Staten Island Ferry and pass by the Statue of Liberty. There will be a coach provided for 8 hours today. Enjoy the remainder of the day exploring Manhattan. You might enjoy visiting the High Line, Central Park, and the Lincoln Center. Farewell dinner in Manhattan and overnight.

DAY 5 - Tuesday, June 10, 2025 - Depart New York City

Breakfast is included this morning (\$15 gift card per person). Depart New York (flight/coach costs for transfer from NYC to your home destination are not included in this proposal but can be priced on request) taking with you lifelong memories of exploring New York City and performing at Carnegie Hall.
