Artistic Experience

Join Heather Sorenson and Michael Trotta for a unique opportunity to perform their "Requiems" at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. Heather and Michael will lead rehearsals, and provide insightful background about their compositions. Artistic faculty, including conductor, instrumentalists, and production team, will be provided. Chorus development, rehearsal space, and professional collaborators are included in the preparation. Enjoy a catered post-concert reception, archival recording, and complimentary photos. Hotel accommodations, transportation, and meals are provided, with rehearsals at the Holiday Inn Capitol.

National Cathedral

The Washington National Cathedral, officially known as the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, is a prominent landmark in Washington, D.C. with a rich history and a significant role in both music and national events.

History: Construction of the National Cathedral began in 1907 and was completed in 1990. The cathedral is the sixth largest in the world and serves as the seat of the presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church. It has been the site of numerous historical events, including state funerals, inaugural prayer services, and memorial services.

Music: The National Cathedral has a strong musical tradition, featuring a renowned choir and hosting various musical events. The cathedral's acoustics and majestic architecture contribute to the exceptional musical experience for both performers and audiences. The cathedral houses a grand organ with over 10,000 pipes, making it one of the largest organs in the world. Heather Sorenson Composer & Conductor

Heather Sorenson is an internationally known composer, arranger, and orchestrator whose works are performed in churches, schools, universities, concerts, and competitions worldwide. Initially recognized for her skill as a pianist, she is now widely known for her choral and instrumental works, with hundreds of compositions in print through various publishing houses including Hal Leonard, Shawnee Press, Alfred Music, the Lorenz Corporation, Hope Publishing, Lillenas, Fred Bock Music, and others.

Eclectic in her musicianship, Ms. Sorenson easily maneuvers the contemporary, traditional, and classical genres of music. Her ability to navigate such a wide diversity of style and venue earns her the qualification of being one of the most versatile musicians in the industry. Her recent commissions include works for Texas A&M University and the John F. Kennedy Memorial Foundation, in addition to many privately-funded commissions. Her latest extended commissions are *Requiem*, and *These Ancient Words*, large works that live in both the concert hall and the sanctuary.

Teaching has been a large part of Ms. Sorenson's career. She taught all elementary levels of music at Grace Academy of Dallas for 4 years, served as an adjunct instructor at Baylor University, and was Music Associate at Lavon Drive Baptist Church (Garland, TX) for fourteen years. She has served on many master class panels in piano and songwriting, and is a sought-after guest speaker and conductor at churches across America, leading scores of sessions each year at various worship conferences, schools, and universities.

Currently Ms. Sorenson spends her time juggling a full writing load as well as traveling as a guest artist and lecturer. In her free time, she is usually planning and performing benefit concerts for her favorite non-profit organizations. Ms. Sorenson makes her home in the Dallas, TX area with her beloved dog, Darla.



Michael John Trotta Composer & Conductor

Fueled by a passion for combining tradition and innovation, American composer Michael John Trotta (b.1978) creates music that resonates with modern audiences around the world. From Carnegie Hall to cathedrals and concert halls around the world, he creates "elegant, singable music with a strong, spiritual heft" (Choir and Organ Magazine).

Seasoned by his experience as a conductor at the primary, secondary, and university levels – as well as a church music director – his works are infused with an "intimate knowledge of the human voice and a rare sensitivity to the capabilities of a choral ensemble" (Fanfare). The "dynamic interplay of time-honored musical gestures with present-day sonorities" (Choral Scholar) create "tender harmonies and a palette of glowing vocal and instrumental colors" (Gramophone).

In addition to a significant output of music for unaccompanied choir, he has written nine choral-orchestral works on a larger scale. His most recent work, *Requiem*, was recorded by Tenebrae Choir (Nigel Short, conductor).

Tour Itinerary

DAY 1 - Tuesday, April 22, 2025 - Travel to Washington, D.C.

Depart from your destination on a flight or by coach to Washington, D.C. (flight/coach costs for transfer from your destination to Washington, D.C. are not included in this proposal but can be priced on request). Arrive and make your own way to the hotel for check in. Dinner will be on your own. You'll have evening rehearsals at the hotel with either Michael or Heather depending on which *Requiem* you are singing (rehearsals will be done simultaneously at the hotel). Overnight at the Holiday Inn Capitol.

DAY 2 - Wednesday, April 23, 2025 - Washington, D.C.

Breakfast is included at the hotel. This morning you'll have a rehearsal with either Michael or Heather depending on which *Requiem* you are singing (rehearsals will be done simultaneously at the hotel). Afternoon and evening will be free at leisure to explore D.C. on own. Dinner on your own. Overnight at the Holiday Inn Capitol.

DAY 3 - Thursday, April 24, 2025 - Washington, D.C. / Gala Concert

Breakfast is included at the hotel. This morning you'll have free time to explore and visit some of the many amazing museums in Washington, D.C. You'll have an afternoon dress rehearsal at the National Cathedral (transfers included). You'll break for dinner on your own before this evening's Gala Concert at the National Cathedral. Enjoy a post concert buffet reception. Overnight at the Holiday Inn Capitol.

DAY 4 - Friday, April 25, 2025 - Depart Washington, D.C.

Breakfast is included at the hotel. Check out following breakfast. Depart Washington, D.C. taking with you lifelong memories of exploring our nation's capital and performing at the National Cathedral (flight/coach costs for transfer from D.C. to your home destination are not included in this proposal but can be priced on request).
